Reporting Fraud

Complaints of fraud in Ohio's governments may be made any time by any public employee or private citizen.

Ohio Revised Code §117.103 requires all public employers to notify employees of the methods of reporting fraud. New hires must verify in writing, within 30 days, that they have been advised of the system, and the Auditor of State's (AOS) office will verify compliance during regular audits. The AOS has created a <u>Fraud Reporting Model Form (pdf)</u> to help employers comply with these requirments.

Request a Public Log Fraud Report

The Ohio Auditor of State maintains a public log of fraud reported through the Ohio Fraud Report System. It includes the date of the report, the entity complained of, the nature of the complaint, and the status of the review of the complaint.
